## NOTICE OF RACE

### RULES

The organising authority of the regatta is the Somerton Yacht Club.  
The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing.  
The class rules of measurement shall apply to boats sailing in races at Somerton Yacht Club.

### ADVERTISING

Advertising will be as defined by ISAF regulation 20 (refer to ISAF website).  
Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the organising authority.  
The organising authority reserves the right to refuse advertising by a boat or competitor when it conflicts with an event sponsor or the laws of the South Australian or Australian Governments.

### ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

The regatta is open to any boats.  
Entry is available to all sailors who are current sailing members of Somerton Yacht Club.  
Eligible boats may enter by completing submitting a Safety Nomination form and paying the race nomination fee or mark the form "BULK NOM" if the boat has paid the annual bulk nomination fee.

### NOMINATION FEES

Required fees are in AUD as follows:

### SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The sailing instructions are published separately and are available on the clubs website ([somertonyc.com.au](http://somertonyc.com.au)) or from the Rear Commodore Sailing.

### VENUE

Racing will be conducted on the Gulf of St Vincent in the vicinity of the Somerton Yacht Club.

### THE COURSES

The courses to be sailed will be posted on the course notice board at least 60 minutes prior to the warning signal for the first start.

The course diagram will be drawn as port hand to show the layout of the course and the order in which marks shall be passed.

No later than the warning signal, the race committee signal boat will display a red or green flag to indicate the direction of racing.

### **PENALTY SYSTEM**

Rules 44.1 and 44.2 will apply for races in all series.

### **SCORING**

The Low Point System of Appendix A will apply.

Four races are required to be completed to constitute a series.

### **SAFETY**

All competitors shall wear a personal flotation device which is in good condition and is in accordance with the specifications issued or approved by a national authority or standards organisation and branded in the country of origin or manufacture. Refer to Yachting Australia Special Regulations, Addendum A, R1.

Attention is drawn to Rule 1.2 and to Rule 4, which states: The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone.

The penalty for Rule 41, Outside Help shall be at the discretion of the Protest Committee.

Actions of the Race Committee in retrieving crews from the water and returning them to their boats may not be penalised.

The sail number of a boat which receives outside help may be notified to the Race Committee with details of the incident and a hearing may be held (if required) to determine any penalty.

### **SUPPORT BOATS**

Approved Support Boats shall keep at least 100m clear of the course area during racing, except when asked to assist by the race committee.

### **RIGHTS TO USE NAME AND LIKENESS**

In participating in an event, a competitor automatically grants to the organising authority and the sponsors of the event, the right in perpetuity, to make, use and show, from time to time and at their discretion, any motion pictures, still pictures and live, taped or film television and other reproductions of him/her during the period of the competition for the said event in which the competitor participates and in all material related to the said event without compensation.

### **RADIO COMMUNICATION**

While on the water, a boat shall not carry equipment capable of making radio transmissions or receiving radio transmissions except for equipment provided by the organising authority. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones.

### **PRIZES**

Prizes will be given as follows:

Heron Club Championship (and runner-up)

Paper Tiger Club Championship (and runner-up)

Mosquito Club Championship (and runner-up)

Tasar Club Championship (and runner-up)

Sabre Club Championship (and runner-up)

Club Sailor of the Season (each class)

Other prizes may be awarded by the Organising Authority.

**DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY**

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See rule 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with, or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

**INSURANCE**

Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of \$5M AUS or the equivalent. All owners/competitors who sign the Entry Form are deemed to have made a declaration that they hold such cover.
